The requirements for **Auditory Acuity** are set by the P.O.S.T. Council and are based upon the Idaho Juvenile Detention/Corrections Officer Job Analysis Study.

The Idaho "Juvenile Detention/Corrections Officer Job Analysis Study" describes the need for **Auditory Acuity** as follows:

It has been clearly proven that normal hearing is needed to adequately perform the job functions of an Idaho Juvenile Detention/Corrections Officer. At least the ability to hear normal speech is needed to perform central job functions including:

Apply use of force continuum – Need to hear normal conversation levels and whispers.

Conduct justified strip searches, Search room for contraband, maintenance and defacement – Need to hear normal conversation and hear radio.

Conduct ongoing threat assessment, Perform facility perimeter checks inside and outside, Use observation skills – Need to hear direction of sound and words at normal conversation level speech at 15 feet. Hear whispers (not necessarily specific words) at 10 feet. Hear sound from intercoms and radios.

Conduct pat searches, Put mechanical restraints on/off, Verbally deescalate juveniles – Hear whispering, direction of sounds and normal conversations.

Conduct/perform universal precautions – Hear normal conversation.

Coordinate/communicate with other shifts – Hear normal conversation and direction of sound to know who is talking.

Gather information from admitting agency/juvenile upon entrance – Hear direction and level of normal conversation to learn of possible threats. Hear sounds of whispering.

Inspect/distribute mail – Hear normal conversation and direction of sound to identify person answering.

Intervene in physical confrontations between juveniles/juveniles' staff – Hear conversations at 5 feet. Hear suspicious sound of whispers and the direction of sound to detect location of possible emergencies.

Monitor/use surveillance equipment – Hear normal conversation, whispering and sounds from intercom speaker.

Operate emergency equipment – Need to hear suspicious sounds of whispering and the direction of sounds to facilitate fast response. Need to hear buzzers and radios.

Perform physical restraint of juveniles – Hear normal conversation, whispering and direction of sounds to detect emergencies and other needs, so proper action can be initiated.

Binaural (two-eared) hearing allows officers to detect sound sources and direction, essential to Juvenile Detention/Corrections Officers' work.

To the examining Audiologist/Physician: The above named applicant has chosen a career as an Idaho Juvenile Detention/Corrections Officer. A "Pure Tone Threshold Test" is required prior to acceptance into the Idaho Peace Officer Standards and Training Academy.

Based upon the Idaho Juvenile Detention/Corrections Officer Job Task Analysis Study an officer *must* meet the following minimum requirements:
